History of Shag

The foundation of shag was built in the late 1930 from variations of circle dancing called The Big Apple which found its way from a black night club in Columbia, S.C. to the lights of Broadway and likewise gained world renown. The shag coming on the heels of Jazz, Lindy Hop, Jitterbug, and the Big Apple still is one of the most popular dances in the Carolinas. The shag has survived, in a state of constant growth and change, for over 60 years. The dance has not only endured it has grown in popularity and became the state dance of SC.

How and when did the word shag become attached to the traditional fast dance of the Carolinas? No one really knows for sure. Almost everyone who performs the shag has a different story. We do know that the dance was copied from a Black night club in Columbia, SC and slowed down to what was then referred to as the Carolina Shuffle. We also know that the music they danced to was by Black artists and could not be heard on the radio because at that time, late 40's early 50's, they would not play black music on the radio. The kids would buy the music and put it on the juke boxes at the beaches in North and South Carolina. The term "shag" became popular in the early to mid-sixties and before that it was known as the "dirty shag". The girls had to sneak away from home to shag because their parents thought it was vulgar. In the old days, it was not cool to learn to shag in public. You stood rather sheepishly in the crowd and watched top dancers workout. You tried to mentally photograph their moves. Later you went home and danced with the doorknob to learn these steps.

Nostalgia for the shag took root in the early Seventies. Competitive dancing generated another growth spurt. The major growth occurred in 1980 when Gene Laughter from Richmond, VA. an old lifeguard from Ocean Drive, wanted to have a reunion for all those that worked during the summer at the beach in the fifties. He hoped for a couple of hundred to come to the beach for a weekend and a thousand showed up. This started 2 events per year known as SOS (Society of Stranders). It has since grown to over 10,000 shagger per gathering and a third event was added called mid-winter which also attracts thousands in January. Also, about this time the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs was formed. Today SOS and ACSC list members from Cincinnati to St. Louis, San Diego to Memphis. It is estimated that over 800,000 people nationwide are familiar with the shag.

The dance is the smooth sliding of feet with emphasis on legs and knees with very little hip movement. Shaggers wear smooth bottom leather soled shoes so they can easily slide across the floor. Bass Weejuns are still the preferred shoe and usually worn without socks.

An unwritten code of shagging is no drinks or smoking on dance floor. A shagger will never refuse to dance with another shagger (this was started because in the beginning there was a shortage of female dancers, so everyone shared partners). Women nowadays have the right to ask men to dance and men are under an equal obligation to accept.

There is a Shagger's Hall of Fame composed of those that started the craze and those that kept the dance alive.


